STUDENTS ARE ADVISED TO GO THROUGH THE NOTIFICATION BELOW BEFORE FILLING THE ON-LINE ADMISSION FORM

- 1. A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st Semester of the 3-year B.A/B.Sc/B.com (Hons./Gen.) course of studies provided he/she has also **passed in English** having full marks not being less than 100.
- 2. For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the Honours course, aggregate marks shall be calculated by **adding the marks of top four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate**. However, marks obtained in **Environmental Education/ Studies** as a compulsory subject at the H.S (10+2) Examination conducted by the West Bengal Council of H.S. Education or its equivalent **shall not be taken** into account for calculating the aggregate marks. If the subject "**Environmental Science**" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, **it may be taken** into account for calculating the aggregate marks.
- 3. a. Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/ Councils or State Boards/Councils including Open Schools and vocational studies, are eligible for study at the UG level.
 - b. No migration certificate will be needed for Registration under this University.

- c. Any dispute regarding eligibility criteria would be resolved by the Equivalence Committee set up by the University.
- 4. No candidate shall be allowed for admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination or discontinuation of recognized regular courses of study after passing the previous qualifying examination.

The year of admission will not be taken into account while calculating **3 years** from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

- 3. Reserved Seats: Scheduled Caste- 22%, Scheduled Tribe- 6%, and OBC 17% (OBC A 10%, OBC B 7%). Persons with disabilities will enjoy a 3% reservation in each of the reserved categories and in the unreserved or general category. However, candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribe community taking up Honours Course of study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate and 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examinations, as the case may be. 5% relaxation in the marks will be provided for Persons with disabilities for admission in any course. Any dispute regarding eligibility criteria would be resolved by the equivalence Committee set up by the West Bengal State University.
- 4. The merit shall be calculated on the basis of Marks obtained in "Best of Four subjects" (Excluding Environmental Studies/ Education) and Marks obtained in the subject or related subject, whichever is higher, in which admission to Honours Course is sought. For General Courses the aggregate of "Best of Four subjects" will be considered for merit calculation.

Application for admission must be made on-line through our website **www.ddmrm.org** or directly go to **www.onlineddmrm.org.in**After provisional admission through on-line all the attested copies of testimonials, are to be submitted within the notified date and time. The Originals must be produced at the time of counselling at college.
- 6. For the B.A. and B.Sc. (Honours and General) course of studies, a candidate is required to choose his/ her Honours and two/ three elective subjects, as the case may be, as given in the on-line application form. Applicant may choose Elective Subject(s) as per his/her choice. But finally the said subject(s) will be offered to him/her on availability or eligibility at the time of / after admission.
