- Understand how trade causes economic development for Less Developed Countries (LDCs), particularly with reference to the issues of Balance of Payment, economicdependency of LDC in terms of different theories.
- Understand the arguments in favour of protection and how different types of tradeprotectionist measures affect social welfare of LDCs.
- Interpret how inflow of foreign capital in terms of Multi National Corporations (MNCs) affects the economic development of host LDCs.
- Explore the debate between state and market in solving the fundamental economic problems of an economy and how they address the issue of social welfare.
- Understand the development of different International Financial Institutions like IMF, World Bank, WTO etc. and their functioning with special reference to LDCs.

Core Course-13: Indian Economy; ECOACOR13T

- Examine the changes in the policies of the Government in pre and post reform periods in the fields of money and capita market, public economics and external sectors.

- Understand the basis of trade between nations of the world, the notion of terms
 of trade and how free trade can be mutually beneficial for the trading nations in
 terms of the Classical and Neo-Classical theories of trade by exploring the idea of
 comparative cost advantage,
- Evaluate the relationship between country size and gains from trade and how trade affects distribution of factor income among the trading nations
- Be familiar with, and be able to critically analyze the main arguments for protection and be able to critically evaluate the relevance and realism of arguments for free trade, taking into account the costs and benefits of different trade policy measures like tariff, quota, voluntary export restraints, export subsidy etc. on economic welfare of the nation
- Explain how international flow of goods, services and capital affects foreign exchange reserve as well as foreign exchange rate of a nation and how expenditure adjustment and expenditure switching trade policies help a nation to achieve both internal and external balance.

Introductory Microeconomics

Through a detailed study of the texts prescribed in this paper, the students would learn to apprehend and analyze the fundamentals of Modernism, Modernity, colonial and racist consciousness, ideologies of Freud and Jung, stream of consciousness, Post-Modernism and about the aesthetic innovations in terms of science, art and literature.

DSE₁

After the successful completion of this paper the students will have an introductory understanding of English Literature, its emergence and subsequent evolution. In addition, they will learn the fundamentals of English as a language, the intonations, the word formations, the foreign influence on the language, rhythmic structures, and the figures of speech.

DSE₂

This paper enables the students to apprehend and examine the various types of literature. They would also become well acquainted with the various literary terms that will help them accomplish a critical, syntactical and thorough understanding of literature.

DSE3

The students will gain a comprehensive understanding about how individual experiences, memories, anecdotes and stories can amount to an alternate history. This paper also facilitates the students to understand and appreciate the power of individual voice, and how it provides a socio-political identity and about the reception of self-writing/life-writing as a literary genre.

SEC (SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSE)

This paper enhances the creative ability of students hence making them better equipped in academic and professional writings. The students will learn the basics and techniques involved in written documents related to media and publication.

2. ENGGDSE01T- LITERARY TYPES AND TERMS

This paper facilitates a better understanding of various types of literature. In addition, they would be made aware about the literary terms that would enable them to assess and comprehend literary texts critically.

3. ENGGDSE02T- RHETORIC, PROSODY AND ESSAY

This paper engages the students into a better understanding of various meter, rhythms and figures of speech of English Language and Literature. The impromptu creating writing ability is also enhanced through this paper.

SEMESTER VI

CC-13

The use of drama and art in education leads to holistic learning, accelerates personality development in students especially when they get the opportunity to role-play in class, and imparts students with crucial life skills, problem-solving skills leadership, cooperation and collaboration. In this paper learners get familiarized with the representative literatry and cultural texts within a significant number of historical, geographical and cultural contexts. As graduates they will have learned to employ knowledge of literary traditions to produce imaginative writing, they will be able to traverse to other realms and times and get exposure to a variety of literary texts and comprehend diverse cultures too. They get to learn about the features of modern European drama and get acquainted with the major literary works of the period and with the diversified movements in post- modernist theatre.

CC-14

The learners learn about the discursive nature of colonialism, and the counter-discursive impulses of postcolonial theory, narratives and performance texts. Thelearners get familiarized about the writing, reading, and critical theoretical practices based on the colonial experience through the selected texts in their syllabus. They gain an insight into internal colonisations of different kinds, including the double colonization of women of colour.

DCE3

The learners get acquainted and gain an insight into the key concepts and texts of literary criticism ever since its emergence.they are able to recognize the political, historical, social and aesthetic dimensions of the growth of literary criticism.

DCE4

The learners gain awareness about one of the most significant literatures produced in the English Language from non native speakers of English and non English speaking cultures. They are familiarized with the thematic concerns, genres and trends and practices of Indian writing in English as well as many translated works. Thus, they are exposed to the multi faceted aspects and dimensions of Indian culture and identity. Partition Literature specifically imbues in them the aftermath of the partition movement, the immense suffering that people went through due to the partition movement, the historical background of our country, the double suffering of the females due to sexual oppression they had been subjected to and how people in general reacted to the partition movement, students get familiar simultaneously with the historical background of their country and can comprehend how partition and fragmentation always impedes the holistic development.

Undergraduate course in Geography: Outcome and Future Prospects

Pursuing undergraduate course in Geography (Hons), opens up a multitude of carrier opportunities for a student. On successful completion of the course, with a decent academic score, one can continue higher studies by getting himself/herself enrolled in the M.Sc/M.A course in different Indian universities and post graduate (PG) colleges. This can be further progressed by clearing NET/SET exam to continue a carrier in teaching & research. In addition to core subject one has option to opt for various other subjects like Environmental Studies, Oceanography, and Atmospheric Science for the PG degree. Students can also enroll for B.Ed course, after which they can appear in SSC exam for the post of Assistant Teacher in various Secondary and Higher Secondary Government Sponsored Schools. Students having a fascination for administrative jobs can appear in PSC, Civil Service (WBCS, IAS) exams. In addition to these conventional carrier opportunities many new areas are emerging. The present CBCS syllabus gives the students a holistic understanding of the putting equal wattage to the core content and techniques used in Geography. The syllabus is so designed that it helps the students to develop basic skills of the subject that enables them to secure a job at the end of the curriculum. Adequate emphasis on the applied aspects of the subject like state-of-the-art mapping techniques and field based data generation helps to secure jobs as cartographers, surveyors in different mapping organizations like NATMO, SOI. A diploma course in GIS and Remote Sensing makes the students eligible for the Post of GIS specialists.

how the changes taken place in these fields and pave the way for early Middle Ages.

Course Code-HISACOR04T: Social Formations and the Cultural Patterns of the

Medieval World

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This course covers the history of the Roman Empire as well as the beginning of the medieval period in Europe.

Course Code-HISGCORT02T: History of India (from C.300 to1206CE)

This course makes students aware about the history of the Guptas and the period after the Guptas. They will learn the politics of integration during the Guptas and subsequent disintegration after them which helps the Turks to establish the Delhi Sultanate.

Semester -III

Course Code-HISACOR05T :History of India (from c750CE to 1206CE)

This Course deals with the history of early medieval phase in Indian history, the impact of foreign invasions on Indian sub-continent and the foundation of a rule with completely different type of political, cultural and religious ethos.

Course Code-HISACOR06T: Rise of the Modern West

This course is designed to aware students of a period of transition of human life which has shaken the ideas of mankind regarding every aspect of human civilisation to the core.

Course Code-HISACOR07T: History of India (from 1206CE to 1526CE)

This course depicts the history of the Delhi Sultanate. The first foreign power to control the whole of India by subjugating the local forces. However in course of time the foreign flavour fades away and a blending of two different cultures have taken place which can easily be seen in the cultural developments during this period.

Course Code-HISGCOR03T: History of India (from 1206CE to 1707CE)

This course describes the history of the Delhi Sultanate. The first foreign power to control the whole of India by subjugating the local forces. However in course of time the foreign flavour fades away and a blending of two different cultures have taken place which can easily be seen in the cultural developments during this period. The same thing can be said about the following Mughal era. The Great Mughals like Akbar is the best example of syncretism in the Medieval Indian history. The modern researches have thrown new lights on the middle ages of Indian history which helps students to think of this period in a new perspective.

Course Code-HISSSECO1M : Archives and Museums in India

This course introduces students to the institutions that house and maintain documentary, visual and material remains of the past. Museums and archives are among the most important such repositories and this course explains their significance and how they work.

Course Code-HISACOR08T : Rise of Modern West

This paper covers the history of the rise of the modern Europe. The changes which brings the modernization in Europe are innovation and development in the field of science; emergence of new economic ideas favourable for capitalist development and political transformations to bring about absolute monarchy.

Course Code-HISACOR09T : History of India (from 1526CE to 1757CE)

This paper covers the entire Mughal rule from the foundation to its decline. The Mughal period is an age of syncretism which can be seen in the field of culture and politics. The recent researches especially by the Aligarh School throw new lights on the Mughal rule to view the period in a new perspective.

Course Code-HISACOR10T: History of India (from 1757CE to 1857CE)

This is a period of foundation and consolidation of the British rule in India. It begins with the defeat of Nawab Siraj of Bengal by the East India Company in 1757 to the suppression of the Great Revolt of 1857.

Course Code HISGCOR04T: History of India (from 1707 to 1950CE)

This course covers the entire British era from the establishment of colonial rule to the discontent of people, the emergence of political conciousness, the freedom movement and finally the independence from the British yoke.

Course Code-HISSSE02M : Understanding Indian Art

The purpose of this course is to introduce students to Indian art from ancient to contemporary times in order to understand and appreciate its diversity and aesthetic richness. The course will equip students with the abilities to understand art as a medium of cultural expression.

Semester -V

Course Code-HISACOR11T: History of Europe (from1789CE-1919CE)

This course is designed to enlighten students about the modern European history. After finishing this course students will be able to understand some epoch making events in the modern world history like the course of the French Revolution and its impact on world history; Napoleon's rise to power; unification of different European countries; imperialist expansion and beginning of the First World War.

Course Code-HISACOR12T: History of India(from1858CE-1947CE)

This course is framed to make students aware of the aftermath of the Great Revolt of 1857 and its impact on Indian history; emergence of political consciousness among the people; early phase of Indian Freedom Movement and the birth of Indian National Congress; the Gandhian era in Indian politics; the incidents leading towards freedom; communal politics and partition of India.

Course Code-HISADSE01T Aspects of the History of Modern South East Asia-I Course Code-HISADSE02T Aspects of the History of Modern South East Asia-II

These two courses throw light on the history of South East Asia from establishment of colonial rule to independence. The aim is to make students aware of the fact that all south east Asian countries share more or less similar historical traditions, the similar interactions with the foreign powers, the growth of political consciousness in the same way, the same courses of freedom movement and finally the independence from colonial oppression after the Second War.

Course Code- HISGDSE01T: Society and Economy of Modern Europe (from c.15th to 18th century)

This course covers the most important phase of European history consisting of decline of feudalism, Renaissance and Reformation Movement; beginning of the era of geographical discoveries and colonisation in different parts of the world; transition to capitalism and birth of Industrial Revolution in England

Course Code-HISSSE03M: An Introduction to Archaeology

This course contains definitions and components, historiographical trends, research methodologies, definitions of historical sites and explorations. The aim of this course to enlighten the students about the basic knowledge of archaeology

Semester VI

Course Code-HISACOR13T: History of India (since 1947 CE)

This course depicts the history of the emergence of a new state facing the challenges of partition and rehabilitation. It covers various aspects of post-colonial politics, economy, society and culture till 1970s.

Course Code-HISACOR14T: Trends in World Politics (CE 1919-2001CE)

The aim of this course to introduce students to the history of world politics since 1919. This is a period of turmoil facing the challenges of the 2nd World War; its impact on world politics; the emergence of Cold War; the birth of a bipolar world; disintegration of Soviet Union-end of bipolar politics; finally rise of terrorism - 9/11 and its impact on world politics.

Course Code-HISADSE04T: History of Modern East Asia I (1839CE to 1919CE) Course Code-HISADSE05T: History of Modern East Asia II (1919CE to 1939CE)

The aim of these courses to make students aware of the fact that two neighbouring countries like China and Japan who share more or less similar historical traditions develop themselves in to two different ways from the middle of the 19th century after their interactions with the west. When Japan advances rapidly towards capitalist development China lags behind.

Course Code-HISGDSE04T: Some Aspects of European History (C1789 to1939 CE)

This course is designed to inform the course of modern European history from the French Revolution and its impact on world history to the outbreak of the Second World War.

Course Code-HISGGE02T :Some Perspectives of Women Rights in India
