

On 14th September, 2020, the Department of Philosophy hosted a webinar featuring Dr. Arnab



health and economic impacts. Dr.




Mukhopadhyay began by situating the COVID-19 pandemic within the broader historical and

He spoke about the changes in work, education, and interpersonal relationships, and how these changes might lead to a reevaluation of societal values and priorities. we need to carry on with the deductive logical structure for ensuring a certainty of win, at the same time we need to be careful the premises whose truth are determined by inductive methods.

The online three-day workshop on Critical Thinking held on April 19-20 and November 30, 2021, brought together educators, students, and professionals to delve into the principles and applications of critical thinking. The workshop featured sessions by Prof. Maduchhanda Sen and a keynote address by Prof. Raghunath Ghosh, providing participants with valuable insights and practical tools to enhance their critical thinking skills.

Keynote Address by Prof. Raghunath Ghosh

Key Points:

- **Definition and Relevance:** Prof. Ghosh defined critical thinking as the capacity to objectively analyze and evaluate information. He emphasized its growing importance in an age of information overload and digital misinformation.
- Educational Imperative: Highlighted the necessity of embedding critical thinking in educational curricula to equip students with essential problem-solving and decision-making skills.
- **Practical Applications:** Discussed the application of critical thinking in various fields, including science, technology, business, and everyday life.

Sessions by Prof. Maduchhanda Sen

Day 1: April 19, 2021

Session 1: Introduction to Critical Thinking

Key Points:

- **Core Components:** Covered the fundamental components of critical thinking: analysis, evaluation, inference, explanation, and self-regulation.
- **Cognitive Biases:** Identified common cognitive biases such as confirmation bias, availability heuristic, and anchoring, explaining how they impede objective thinking.

Session 2: Developing Analytical Skills

Key Points:
